Box 214 Halifax, Nova Scotia Dear Mr. Harris: In that I have been out of town a great deal I have neglected to answer your letter of September 28, and too, I have been waiting on news regarding Oak Island so that you may have more definate answers. NW.7 At the present time I am unable to continue my program and Tosins the lease has been awarded to a fellow in Montreal. This group has asked me to help as project manager for a healthy interest. In view of the latter I have accepted and the program will include comprehensive core drilling and investigation of two other areas. When the project will start I do not know. As you understand from the sketch I sent to you flood tunnels to the money pit are ruled out owing to the presence of the Windsor formation at 140 feet in depth. During our excavation of the money pit we noted no water (except surface drainage) entering above 140 feet. It is my findings that the drainage system at Smith's Cove and a very short flood tunnel is restricted to that area and I would hope to see this excavated. It is reasonable that the Municipality or the Province will purchase the Island for park purposes. I would like to see this done and it would not jeopardize further exploration. Should I return to Oak Island I would be most happy to pass on to you coconut fiber you spoke of. Many thanks for your interest and I hope this letter finds you in good health.
