Dear Mr.Harris:, I have not heard from you since your

letter of January 11th and I am just wondering if you are getting anyw where with your preparation of the agreements, particularly the one for the woming season. Time passes rather rapidly and it will soon be June and time to start work again. I am very anxious to continue with Hamilton and would not like to have anything cause him to lose interest.

I would suggest that you prepare as simply as possible an extension of my original agreement with Blair together with an acknowledgement that the terms of division are changed. I believe it was decided and agreed upon by Blair that they should now be 60-40 and my terms with Hamilton were on a 50/50 basis of our share, giving us each 30%. I would suggest that you prepare a rough draft and forward it to me for my comment.

I propose to keep in rather close touch with the work this year as I think it will be unusually important and I shall probably arrange. to be on the site as soon as Hamilton gets well under way. It is my intention to make all necessary notes and drawings to preserve any data acquired for future reference. To do this will possibly require a bit of expense and I would like to have you make any inquiries that you can on the possibility of my marketing some or all of the stand of lumber on the island. Will you let me hear from you at your early convenience. Best wishes to all.
