Dear Br. Hedden:-

I am in receipt of yours of the 8th instant enclosing letter from Sprigg & Henwood, I immediately got into touch with the Nova Scotia Power Commission and found that the Bova Scotia Light & Power Company have the only power lines in the Chester territory. The Power Commission would however be able to help to the extent of supplying a secondhand Deisal engine, generator and other equipment. I then waited on the General Manager of the Nova Scotia Light & Power Company and found that following up their telegram to Spragg & Reawood they had made the following proposition to make a charge of \$3500 and a rebate of \$1000.00 so that the met cost would be \$2500.00. They require the deposit of a cheque for \$4000.00, it being understood that \$500.00 of this is as security for accounts for power. In return you will receive simple interest. They will also give you the bonefit of any lower prices that they may be able to get or effect by using secondhand material, providing of course that it is up to the standard. Hy agreement is with the General Manager and I know that he is a man of his word in this respect.

Henwood, to whom the above offer has already been communicated.
