

## The Oak Island Story

Since 1795 man has searched for treasure on Oak Island, Nova Scotia. Today they still search - lured on by legend and stymied by an engineering masterpiece that still holds the secret of the Money Pit.

The search for treasure has been expensive, costing close to \$2,000,000 over the years. Six lives have been lost in the venture.
