to a reporter at the time. "That treasure sort of pricks everyone's curiosity; how it got there, when and why. We found enough information below to the surface to know that something went on and next may or june (1956) I'll be back to finish the job." (he never did return).

Greene believed the Spaniards made the oak island deposit.

Sept. 18/78

A George J. Greene of Corpus Cristi (obviously the same Greene) was flying over Mt. Arrarat in Turkey doing geological research in 1952 when he spotted Nankax Noah's Ark and took photographs of it.

Greene was murdered in British Guinea on Dec. 27, 1962. Since then others have tried to track down the photos, but with no success.

Did the photos ever exist or is the whole story a myth. I suspect the latter.
